CIRCULAR

The Directorate of Training is entrusted with the basic responsibility of conducting training programmes for various levels of officials/officers in various areas of administration. The Directorate has identified subjects needing basic knowledge and skill for functional efficiency. A three days training course on "Basic Functional Efficiency in Vigilance Matters" is an important course in the list. The Course shall commence on 05th January, 2011 to 07th January, 2011 (Wednesday to Friday).

IMPORTANCE OF THE COURSE

There is a set of norms of expected behaviour and conduct for the Government functionaries and also a legal framework to combat corruption in public life. While it is important to protect honest Government functionary from harassment, it is essential that instances of misconduct and corruption are dealt with effectively. This requires knowledge of rules, ability to investigate and analyze, and process the instances of misconduct and corruption objectively and according to rules.

TARGET BENEFICIERIES OF THE COURSE

The Course has been designed to benefit those working in the Government, its local/autonomous bodies, Public sector undertakings and directly associated with dealing/processing vigilance/corruption cases. It shall also be useful for those posted in anti-corruption unit of the Government. The course would be useful to functionaries both at the lower/middle management. Training Module/

OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE

At the end of the Course the participants will be able to:

- 1. Explain the necessity of ethics in governance.
- 2. Differentiate between vigilance and non-vigilance cases and roles of various Government agencies entrusted with vigilance/anti-corruption functions.
- 3. Define basic concepts and terms contained in the Vigilance Manual/CCS (Conduct) Rules, CCS (CCA) Rules, POC Act, CVC Act etc. and apply the provisions correctly.
- 4. Identify appropriate disciplinary authority.
- 5. Draft charge-sheets, memorandums and various orders/prosecution sanctions.
- 6. Conduct preliminary/disciplinary enquiry and also examine reports.
- 7. Identify and suggest areas of preventive vigilances.

METHODOLOGY OF THE COURSE

The Course would be conducted by experts and experienced in the area of Vigilance and anti-corruption. While lecture method would be generally followed case studies and practical exercises may also be included in some sessions. The Course would be interactive and participants encouraged to raise questions and get the doubts cleared.

- 1. The Course envisages class strength of 40 Participants.
- 2. Nominations shall be accepted on first-come-first-serve basis.
- Nomination letter along with bio-data form of the participants in the format 3. prescribed (enclosed) may be sent by 29th December, 2010.
- Nominations received after 29th December, 2010 may not be entertained. 4.
- Outstation participants are requested to proceed for training only after receipt of confirmation of acceptance of nomination.
