CIRCULAR

The Directorate of Training is entrusted with the basic responsibility of conducting training programmes for various levels of officials/officers in various areas of administration. The Directorate has identified subjects needing awareness about important social, economic, administrative and various other topics. A One day training course on "General Awareness about Gender Issues" is an important course in the list. The Course shall be held on 08.07.2011.

IMPORTANCE OF THE COURSE:

Gender bias and discrimination against girl child is a global phenomenon that may occur before birth and continue beyond childhood into adulthood. Girl children are exposed to discrimination and violence in all settings, often in places where they should be most protected i.e. in their home, school or even immediate community. The present Training Programme focuses on creating General Awareness about Gender Sensitization, relating mainly to the girl children's survival, nutrition, mortality and neglect in all phases of life.

TARGET BENEFICIARIES OF THE COURSE:

The Course has been designed to benefit those who are working in the Government, its local/autonomous bodies, public sector undertakings. The Course would be useful to all lower/middle level functionaries dealing with Gender Issues.

OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE:

At the end of the Course the participants will be able to:

1. List the problems faced by girl child.
2. Explain the social reasons for the situation.
3. Describe the legal remedies available.

CONTENTS OF THE COURSE:

1. International, National Perspective of Gender Bias & Discrimination
2. Constitutional and Legal Provisions to Self Guard Rights of Girl Child & Women.
3. PNDT Act, 1994 (Pre Natal Diagnostic Techniques) and Domestic Violence Act - 2005 and their Legislative History.
4. Other important Laws & Issues in general on the subject & Case Studies.

METHODOLOGY OF THE COURSE:

The Course would be conducted by experts and those associated with implementation of policy on Gender Issues. While lecture method would be generally followed, discussions and case studies may also be included in some sessions. The course would be interactive and participants encouraged raising questions and getting the doubts cleared.

NOMINATIONS FOR THE COURSE:

1. The Course envisages class strength of 40 participants.
2. Nominations shall be accepted on first-come-first-serve basis.
3. Nomination letter may be sent **latest by 01-07-2011**.
4. Nominations received after 01-07-2011 may not be entertained.
5. Outstation participants are requested to proceed for training only after receipt of confirmation of acceptance of nomination.

5. Participants are expected to complete exercises/questionnaires, if any, distributed by the faculty during any training session and also fill up the feedback form.
6. Participants are expected to utilize the knowledge gained during the training for efficient discharge of their duties.
