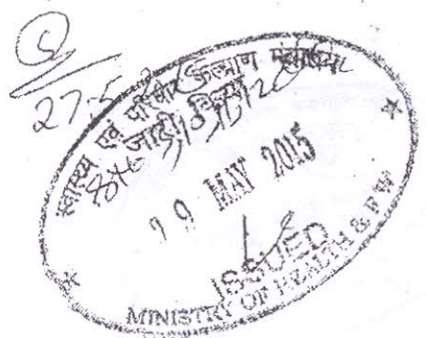

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Revision of time limit for submission of final claims for reimbursement of medical expenses under CS(MA) Rules, 1944 –regarding.

The undersigned is directed to refer to OM No.F.29-40/68-MA dated 15.10.1968 in which it was laid down that submission of final claims for reimbursement of medical expenses of Central Government servants in respect of a particular spell of illness should ordinarily be preferred within 3 months from the date of completion of treatment.

2. A representation was received from National Council (Staff Side) to extend the time limit for submission of such medical bills from 3 months to 6 months. The matter was examined in the Ministry and it has been decided that the period of 3 months for submission of medical claims be revised to 6 months. Henceforth, only the cases in which the bills are submitted after 6 months from the date of completion of medical treatment/discharge of the patient from the hospital are required to be taken up for condonation. The power of condonation of such delays and other terms and conditions would be same as enumerated in the OM No.S.14025/8/99/-MS dated 25.05.1999.

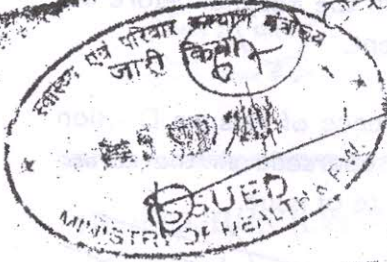

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Sub: Revision of ceiling rates for Intra Ocular Lenses (IOL) - reg

The undersigned is directed to refer to the Office Memorandum, No. S-1413/2005-06/CGHS/R&H dated the 26th June, 2008, issued by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, vide which rates for Intra-Ocular Lenses (IOL) were revised for beneficiaries under CGHS/CS(MA) Rules. Representations were received in the Ministry requesting for revision of rates of IOL. In addition, there were requests from time to time for other ophthalmic procedures as well as for reimbursement for other items of ophthalmic use by the beneficiaries under CGHS/CS (MA) Rules.

2. A Committee of experts was constituted to look into these matters. Following decisions were arrived at by the Expert Committee, which have been approved:-

IOL Categories and revised ceiling rates are recommended for CGHS/CS(MS) beneficiaries

| d. Scleral Fixated IOL | Rs 3,500/- |

2. Reimbursement for LASIK surgery and INTACS Rings is not recommended.

3. Therapeutic and Bandage contact Lenses for Keratoconus of Corneal Ulcers can be considered on a case to case basis.

3. Further, reimbursement for IOL Implants will be limited to ceiling rates or actual, whichever is less and will be reimbursable in addition to the package rates for cataract surgery procedure. The reimbursement at the above mentioned ceiling rates will be done as per the rates fixed for the various types of IOL mentioned above and the IOL actually used in the surgery. It is mandatory for the operating surgeon of all private empanelled hospital/CGHS & CS(MA) beneficiaries to attach the empty IOL
