CIRCULAR

Subject: Bharatiya Bhasha Mahotsav

Reference D.O. No. 01-06/2023-IS.8/IS.14 dated 28th November, 2023 (Annexure A)

As per above D.O., Ministry of Education is celebrating Bharatiya Bhasha Mahotsav for 75 days starting from 28th September in schools, colleges, universities and other educational institutions. The Janma Jayanti of Mahakavi Subramania Bharati on 11th December, 2023 (Monday) shall be celebrated as Bharatiya Bhasha Utsav - A Language Festival for enjoying the beauty of language, its diversity and to experience the feeling of oneness in that diversity.

Bharatiya Languages are the primary vehicles of Bharatiya culture, arts, music, thoughts and the bonds of unity and harmony of people of Bharat. All of them are intertwined and inseparable and emanates from the languages. Hence celebrating Bharatiya Bhasha Utsav in festive fervor and vigor will energize the students and fill them with pride and confidence.

In this regard multilingual activities shall be organised in all the schools of Delhi on Monday, the 11th December, 2023 to give momentum to multi linguistic theme of NEP. Every School shall hold a day-long festival with the participation of students, teachers, parents and members of the public. A few suggestive district wise activities are listed below:

The day shall begin with all the students and staff members signing in a Bharatiya language on the big canvas kept at the entrance of school/ classroom to campaign in favor of mother tongue, like '**My Signature in My Mother Tongue**'.

- Extempore speeches, extempore songs, extempore drawings and their combinations in different languages.
- Language games and fun programs through different languages.
- Screening of inspiring films, short films, biographical films and documentaries in different languages.
- Competitions.
- Food courts belonging to different linguistic areas.
- Corners where different languages could be introduced in spoken form in order to make the students experience the thrill of speaking and enjoying a new Bharatiya language.
- Exhibition of charts and other exhibits on various aspects of languages of Bharat (Well-designed exhibits will be provided through the portal).
- Seminar, workshop, debate, etc.
