Please refer to this Ministry's letter No. 25022/22/2008-F.I (Pt.1) dated 28.4.2010 circulating the revised chapters of the Visa Manual including chapter 9 – Conference Visa and to say that the matter regarding the procedure to be followed in respect of conveying clearance for conferences organized by private organizers – an NGO or a private institution, has been under consideration of this Ministry. It has now been decided with the approval of the competent authority to modify para 82 (iii) of the revised Chapter 9 of Visa Manual. Accordingly, the existing para 82(iii) stands modified as under:-

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“(iii) The request for holding international conferences will be submitted by private organizers – be it an NGO or a private institution to the Ministry of Home Affairs (Foreigners Division) within the prescribed time frame i.e. at least 60 days prior to the commencement of the event along with the complete details of the participants from the Prior Reference Category countries (i.e. Afghanistan, China, Iraq, Iran, Pakistan, Sudan, Foreigners

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of Pakistani origin and Stateless persons) in the format given in sub – para (ii) above. Ministry of Home Affairs (Foreigners Division) will examine all such proposals in consultation with the Security Agencies and the Nodal Ministry (wherever it is possible to identify the specific nodal Ministry) for grant of requisite security clearance.”

2. All authorities concerned are requested to comply with the above mentioned instructions.
3. These instructions shall come into force with immediate effect.

Sub: Delay in processing of Citizenship applications of Hindu/Sikh Afghan Nationals submitted under Sections 5 and 6 of the Citizenship Act 1955 read with Rules 2, 11, 12 and 38 of the Citizenship Rules 2009 in various Districts in Delhi.

Sir,

I want to draw your kind attention upon the problems being faced by the Hindu/Sikh Nationals from Afghanistan in getting Citizenship due to delay in processing of Citizenship Applications, which are pending even since last about 4-5 years with some Deputy Commissioners/Sub Divisional Magistrates. (List pertaining to a few applicants is enclosed)

Your good self will appreciate that the Citizenship Applications by Foreign Nationals in these Districts are being submitted with the Offices of Sub Divisional Magistrates. Upon these applications the respective Sub Divisional Magistrates are calling for reports from the respective Police Authorities i.e. D.C.P./F.R.R.O and forwarding these reports to the State/Central Government.

Your good self will appreciate about a year ago the Central Government, i.e. Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India had returned the Citizenship Applications of Foreign Nationals through the State Government of Delhi (through the Office of Deputy Secretary, Passport, GNCT of Delhi) to the Sub Divisional Magistrates with the direction to submit these applications along with a report of Collector, under Rule 12 of the Citizenship Rules 2009 and it has been observed by the Ministry that the Sub Divisional Magistrates are not authorized to sign such Reports as they are not Collectors. Due to this hurdle the applications are lying in various Districts for want of report under Rule 12 of the Citizenship Rules 2009 from the Collectors/Deputy Commissioners. Your good self will appreciate that most of these applications are pending with various Districts since last 4-5 years.

It is also pertinent to mention that under Rule 12 of the Citizenship Rules 2009 the Collector has to forward reports under Rule 12 within 60 days from the date of receipt of an application for Citizenship in his Office.

I want to draw your kind attention upon one more fact regarding the process of Citizenship Applications. There are only two integrated Police Authorities for whole the State of Delhi, the Foreigners Regional Registration Office and the Office of Deputy

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Commissioner of Police, Special Branch, which are dealing with Foreigners for whole the State of Delhi, however the Citizenship Applications are being dealt with in various Districts which are created by division of Police Stations, due to which there is no uniformity in processing of Citizenship Applications in the State of Delhi. **Therefore an integrated Office of Collector/Deputy Commissioner for whole the State of Delhi, to deal with the Citizenship Applications of Foreign Nationals, can keep uniformity in processing Citizenship Applications.**

I request you to please look into the matter and direct the Deputy Commissioners to forward the Citizenship Applications pending with their Districts since last 4-5 years, to the State Government at the earliest.

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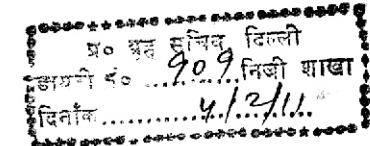

Subject: Grant of Indian Citizenship to Minor Children under Section
4(1) of Citizenship Act, 1955- Clarification regarding 4 (1-A).

Sir,

AS/Home

I am directed to say that Sub Section I-A of Section 4 of
Citizenship Act, 1955 stipulates that a minor who acquires Indian
citizenship by descent as per provisions of sub section 1 of section 4
and is also a citizen of any other country will cease to be an Indian
citizen unless, within six months of attaining full age, he renounces
the citizenship of any other country, held by him. This provision was
inserted by the Citizenship (Amendment) Act, 2003 in order to take
care of a situation where a foreign passport is obtained after
registering birth under this section.

2. Under sub-section IA of section 4, a minor can hold citizenship
of India along with citizenship of any other country i.e. dual citizenship
up to the expiry of six months from the date of his attaining full age.

3. With the approval of competent authority, it is clarified that there
is no compelling reason to guard against a minor child having dual
citizenship. It is conscious provision of law given to a minor so that
he/she can decide within 6 months of completing 18 years of age as
to whether he/she prefers Indian citizenship. If a person does not
renounce foreign citizenship or nationality of another country within
six months of attaining full age, he/she shall cease to be a citizen of
India.



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4. It is further clarified that if a minor has obtained foreign passport before registering at an Indian consulate, he/she shall not be registered as Indian Citizen under Section 4.



Subject: Grant of OCI registration to foreigners of Indian origin borne in India between 1950 and 1987.-clarification regarding.

Sir,

As/ Home

As per Section 7A of the Citizenship Act, 1955, any person of full age and capacity, who is citizen of another country but who was citizen of India on or anytime after 26.1.1950, or was eligible to become Indian citizen on 26th January, 1950, or belonged to a territory that became part of India after 15th August, 1947 is eligible to be registered as OCI. Children and grand children of such a person are also eligible to be registered as OCI.

2. It has been brought to notice of this Ministry that the class of people who are born between 26.1.1950 and 30.6.1987 but never opted for Indian citizenship and obtained the nationality of some other country are now applying for OCI claiming that they are Indian citizen by birth. They quote the clause 3(1) (a) of the Citizenship Act, 1955, which states that every person born in India on or after 26th day of January, 1950 but before the 1st day of July, 1987 shall be citizen of India by birth.

3. As per existing clause 3(1) (a) of the Indian Citizenship Act, 1955 every person born in India on or after 26th January, 1950 but before first day of July, 1987 shall be citizen of India by birth. Further, as per Section 7(A)(a)(i), any person of full age and capacity and who is citizen of another country, but was a citizen of India at the time of, or at any time after, the commencement of the Constitution is eligible to become OCI.



4 With the approval of competent authority, it is clarified that if a person was born between 26.1.1950 and 1.7.1987 in India, whether having any ancestral linkage in India or not, shall be a citizen of India. If the descendants of such a person wish to avail of the benefit of OCI scheme, it is legal that they get the benefit. For such applicants, there is no requirement to prove their Indian origin except for adducing evidence to show that their claim is derived from a person born in India between 26.1.1950 and 1.7.1987.

5. This clarification may be brought to the notice of all concerned.


