#### OFFICE ORDER

#### Regarding Distribution of fresh printed BPL cards.

Vide this Office Order No 369 dated 21-05-2010 it was directed that individual notices, be written to all the applicants whose cards had been prepared and printed but could not be distributed because they did not turn up for collection of Ration Cards by the process of Bio-metric Identification.

In these notices it was clarified that the last date of collection of such cards was 30-06-2010, failing which it would be presumed that the applicant does not reside at the given address or ineligible for issuance of BPL Card.

The distribution of all such cards by the process of bio-metric identification printed prior to 21-05-2010, henceforth be stopped and all these cards be treated as cancelled.

All Zonal Assistant Commissioners are directed to comply with the above order and submit a report to the undersigned in this regard indicating the details of such cancelled cards, as per card register latest by 05-07-2010. Aggrieved applicants can file an appeal against this decision to the Zonal Assistant Commissioners within 30 days of issue of this order.

Attention of the Circle Food & Supplies Officers is invited to this Office Memorandum No.F.4(3)/80-CFS(D)/ 21656 dated the 19th August, 83 on the above subject.

The decision of the Apex Consultative Committee of this Department regarding affixation of a photograph of the Head of family on the food-card was implemented in Circles No.11 and 12 only to start with. This was further reviewed by the Commissioner, Food & Supplier in the monthly meeting with the Circle Food & Supplies Officers held on the 9th May, 85 in which it was decided that this scheme should be introduced gradually in all Circles and to begin with; one Circle should be taken up in every zone as per the suggestion of the Zonal Officer. It has now been decided to implement the scheme further in Circles No.4, 8, 10, 16, 31 and 40 1.e. one Circle in each zone.

The Food & Supplies Officers of these Circles are. therefore, directed to take necessary steps for affixation of photographs of Heads of families on all food-cards of their respective Circles. In each case, two copies of photograph of the Head of family attacted by the Municipal Councillor/Me of Netropolitan Council/Member of Parliament/Cazetted Officer or Magistrato, as the case may be, will be required. One corof the photograph will be affixed inside the food-care cover and signed by the Area Inspector at the Fair Price shop! The orher copy of the photograph will be pasted in the register maintained by the Fair Price Thop holder.

The concerned Circle Food & Supplies Officers are directed to ensure that all the food-cards in their respective Circles are affixed by photographs of the Heads of families by the SLot August, 1985.

#### GUIDELINES FOR IDENTIFICATION OF ADDITIONAL FAMILIES UNDER THE EXPANDED (Second one) ANTYODAYA ANNA YOJNA

#### OBJECTIVE:

Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) was launched on the 25th Decemi 2000. This scheme reflects the commitment of the Government of India to ensure food sec. It for all, create a hunger free India and to reform and improve the Public Distribution System (PDS) so as to serve 1 crore poorest of the poor in the rural and urban areas. In pursuance of the Government's initiative in respect of alleviation of hunger amongst the most vulnerable sections, such as old people, widows and disabled persons, without family in societal support and the directive of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Interim Order in CWP No. 196/2001 dated 2.11.2002, the Government of India has expanded the Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) in June, 2003, to cover an additional 50 lakh BPL families from amongst the following priority groups:

- (i) Households headed by widows or terminally ill persons or disabled persons or persons aged 60 years or more with no assured means of subsistence or societal support.
- (ii) Widows or terminally ill persons of disabled persons or persons aged 60 years of more or single women or single men with no assured means of subsistence or societal support.
- (iii) All primitive tribal households. (The tribal beneficiaries under the expanded AAY should be in proportion to the tribal population in the State/UT).

#### PROPOSED EXPANSION

- In line with the National Common Minimum Programme (NCMP) of the UPA Government and the announcement made by the Hon'ble Finance Minister in the Union Bound 2004-05, it has been decided to continue and expand the Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) to cover an additional 50 lakh BPL families. In order to identify these to useholds the following criteria may be adopted:-
  - (a) Landless agriculture labourers, marginal farmers, rural artisans/graftsman such as potters, tanners, weavers, blacksmiths, carpenters, slum developments.

- and persons earning their livelihood on daily basis in the informal sector like porters, coolies, rickshaw pullers, hand eart pullers, fruit and flower sellers snake charmers, rag pickers, cobblers, destitutes and other similar eategories in both rural and urban areas.
- (b) Households headed by widows or terminally ill persons/disable persons/persons aged 60 years or more with no assured means of subsistence or societal support.
- (c) Widows or terminally ill persons or disabled persons or persons aged 6 years or more or single women or single men with no family or society support or assured means of subsistence.
- (d) . All primitive tribal households.

#### SCALE AND ISSUE PRICE:

3. The additional identified families would be provided foodgrains at the rate of 3 Kg, per family per month @ Rs. 2/- per Kg, for wheat and Rs. 3/- per Kg, for rice.

### IDENTIFICATION OF ADDITIONAL ANTYODAYA BENEFICIARIES:

The most crucial element for ensuring the success of expanded AAY is the correct identification of the families in the above mentioned Priority Groups. At present 1.5 cross families are covered under the AAY which constitutes about 23 % of the total estimate number of 6.52 crore BPL families in the country. With the expansion of the scheme the will increase to 2.0 crore families which constitutes about 30.66 % of the total estimate number of BPL families in the country. The identification of the additional Antyoday families will have to be carried out by the State Governments/UT Administrations. The amongst the BPL families within the state who have not yet been covered under the existing AAY. In this regard, the contents of the Letter No 21(5)/2002 -PD-H dated 16 March 2004 issued by this Department may also be taken into account while conducting the identification of beneficiaries. The number of additional Antyodaya households to each State and UT has been worked out and is at Annexure.

The following steps are suggested for identification of the additional Amyoda: households:

(a) The number of additional Antyodaya households has been indicated for early State/UT. The States/UT's may, in turn, distribute this number another various districts, keeping in view the incidence of poverty and as per pair.

#### CIRCULAR

Sub: - Regarding revocation of withdrawn/deleted cards.

Presently, review of AAY ration cards is being carried out by the department During this process call memos are being sent at the addresses of cardholders through Speed Post. Those cardholders who do not turn up for verification or whose letters returned undelivered by Postal Deptt., the cards in respect of such cardholders are withdrawn/deleted from Computer database of the department after obtaining approval of the Competent Authority. Supply of SFAs & K. Oil is stopped against such cards.

It has been observed that some cardholders in respect of above referred withdrawn/deleted cards are approaching Vigilance Branch/Zonal Offices/Circle Offices for revocation of their cards on various grounds such as being out of station or having shifted their residence within the Circle or for non receipt/late receipt of call memo, etc.

The matter has been considered by the Competent Authority and it has been decided that such cases shall be processed by the Asstt. Commissioners. For it, Asstt. Commissioners will take the photocopy of AAY Card and photo identity proof from the Cardholder, get the physical inspection conducted and if Cardholder is found residing, then recommend for restoration of such cards through their Addl. /Joint Commissioner to Computer Branch. On receipt of such recommendation from the Asstt. Commissioners, the AAY Card will be restored and SFAs/S.Koil for these cards will be restored.

#### OFFICE ORDER

The Department of Food & Supplies had decided to review all BPL/AAY Ration Cards by the process of Biometric Identification and the said Policy was duly notified vide Order N.F.3(1)2009/P&C/488 dated 03-12-09 by the Department and also published in the newspapers and displayed on its website; Although a number of opportunities have been given to the all the BPL/AAY Ration Card Holders to get their cards reviewed but before closing the process, keeping in view of principles of natural justice, it has been decided that one last and final opportunity be given to each card holder by sending individual notices by Speed Post. A proforma of such individual notice, duly approved by the Competent Authority is enclosed as Annexure-A.

Similarly, you are aware that the Department has invited applications for issuance of fresh BPL Ration Cards and last date of receipt of such applications was 13-3-2009. But, unfortunately the process is lingering on and has not yet been finalized. During a review meeting in one of the districts, it was observed that even the figures of pending applications have not been properly reconciled by the A.C. It has been decided that all the pending applications should be finalized and Ration Cards be printed if still pending and one last opportunity be given to the applicants by sending individual notices by Speed Post. A proforma of such individual notice duly approved by the Competent Authority, is enclosed as Annexure-B.

It may be recalled that in the last review meeting taken by the Commissioner, Food & Supplies, it was decided that the entire process of issuance of fresh BPL Ration Cards should be completed by 15-6-2010 and similarly process of review of all the old BPL/AAY Ration Cards should be completed by 30-6-2010 and thereafter supply of Specified Food Articles for non-reviewed Ration Cards will be stopped.

All A.Cs are directed to comply with the above instructions and issue individual notices to respective beneficiaries within a week's time. Compliance report alongwith the details of number of notices issued in each category be submitted to the undersigned latest by 31-5-2010.
