ORDER

- 1. Employees' Compensation Act, 1923 provides for expeditious disposal of compensation claims within a period of 90 days from the date of institution of case. The pendency of these cases has remained cause of concern for the Government and in the past various measures were taken to address the issue including appointment of extra Employees Compensation Commissioners to exclusively hear and decide these cases. The Hon'ble High Court of Delhi is also monitoring the pendency of these cases and has issued directions from time to time to dispose of these cases in time bound manner. Though various measures taken to address this issue has resulted into liquidation of the pendency to great extent, however it has also come to notice that pendency of claim cases filed before the Authorities notified under Minimum Wages Act, 1948 and the Delhi Shops and Establishment Act,1954 have also increased.
- 2. The Delhi Cabinet has already approved the proposal for creation of 13 posts of JLC (Legal) for quasi-judicial work in Labour Department. Creation of these posts is under process. In view to provide compensation to the victims and their legal heirs under Employees' Compensation Act, 1923 in time bound manner as well as expeditious disposal of claims under Minimum Wages Act, 1948 and Delhi Shops and Establishment Act, 1954, till the 13 posts of JLC(Legal) are created and filed up, it has been decided to transfer all the pending compensation cases, which have been filed after 01.09.2015 to the following Employees' Compensation Commissioners in respect of the Districts mentioned against their names:-

- 3. Court No. I presided over by Sh. S.K.S. Yadav, DANICS shall function from Ground Floor, C-Block, 5 Sham Nath Marg, Delhi, with immediate effect. He will also coordinate and monitor progress of these cases and will submit a fortnightly report to Secretary (Labour) for his perusal.
- 4. Remaining cases of Sh. Mangal Sain, ALC/CEC and Sh. J.B. Kapil, ALC/CEC shall also be heard by Smt. Anita Rana, DLC/CEC Court No. V.
- 5. The concerned JLCs/DLCs of the district are directed to transfer the case files immediately to the concerned Commissioner, Employees' Compensation. The transferee Employees' Compensation Commissioner shall hear these cases from the stage of pendency. The above mentioned Compensation Commissioners will also continue to hear cases which were earlier allotted to them for the period pre-September, 2015.
- 6. Henceforth, all the new cases would also be filed before the above named Employees' Compensation Commissioners in respect of the Districts mentioned against their names. It is also directed that the above named Employees' Compensation Commissioners shall also operate the Bank Account of Compensation Commissioner of the concerned Districts. The District JLCs/DLCs shall facilitate this and take necessary action in this regard.
- 7. It is further directed that Sh. M.K.Gaur, JLC, Sh. Banbari Lal, DLC, Sh. Anil Bhatnagar, DLC shall transfer 15 cases each pending with them relating to the period prior to 01.09.2015 to their Assistant Labour Commissioners namely Sh. K.M.Singh, Sh. Amardeep and Sh. Narender Singh respectively, to expedite disposal of these cases.
- 8. All the concerned Employees Compensation Commissioners will be responsible for the transfer and safe custody of the records.
