Sh. Satish Chauhan, the appellant vide DRTI application dated 27.12.2017 has sought information from the Deputy Medical Superintendent, Sanjay Gandhi Memorial Hospital / Competent Authority notified under the DRTI Act-2001, on total 15 counts.

The appellant did receive the information from the Competent Authority. However, being aggrieved with the same, he filed an appeal before the Commission.

**Proceedings**

The applicant is absent.

Dr. A.K. Saini, Dy. Medical Superintendent, SGMH / Competent Authority appeared in person and filed a copy of the reply dated 02.07.2018. A copy of the same was given to the appellant during the hearing. Reply perused.

On perusal of the reply, it has been revealed that the department has provided satisfactory information to the appellant.

**Decision**

**Since the department has provided satisfactory information in respect of all the queries posed by the appellant in his DRTI application, no further action is required in the matter. However, if the appellant asked for the inspection of the documents, he may be allowed to inspect the record on mutually convenient date and photocopies of the documents, if asked by the appellant should be provided to the appellant.**

**With the above direction, the appeal stands closed at the Commission's end.**
