*The Chairman desired that all the Institutes should work on each and every aspect. Each one should choose one area, prepare Research papers and conduct Workshops and Seminars on the selected topics. The quality in Education should be the focus.*

*Each participants of the institutes appreciated the points of suggestions and thanked the Chairman for holding such type of Presentation and ensured the Chairman full co-operation in the field of quality of improvement in higher education. The participants have also given their willingness to prepare a **detailed** Paper / Research Paper on selected topics. *(e) Strengthening Support System*

*The followings points were discussed during the meetings:-*

- i) The GGSI University should hold Seminars / Conferences for quality improvement and to raise the image of the University to an International level.*
- ii) The participants expressed that the curriculum of the courses is not being updated by the GGSI University. The University should regularly revise the curriculum of all courses.*
- iii) The University should also provide assistance in increased use of Technology for quality improvement.*
- iv) Efforts to improve quality will also result expenditure, as such the fee should be fixed appropriately to provide for quality improvement.*
- v) Some of the regulations and instructions of the GGSI University are rigid and come in the way of innovation and new initiatives which are being attempted by institutions.*
- vi) In respect of B.Ed., the assignments and practicals are too many, the students have no time for any extra study or extra curricular activities.*
- vii) The University should be in the fore-front to improve quality of education. In fact, it should take leading role in coordinating activities of the Institutions.*
- viii) GGSI University should arrange Workshops and Seminars on suggested tools with the affiliated Institutions for upgradation of the Institutions and Quality Improvement in Higher Education.*
- ix) When Workshops and Seminars are conducted by the University as well as Institutions, participation by the all Institutions is made mandatory.*
- x) Each Institute should have four or five Industries on their panel for interaction with them for updating curriculum as well as using them as sounding Boards for any innovation being thought of by the Institute.*
- xi) All the Institutions should activate their alumni association primarily to get feedback on the knowledge imparted by the Institutions and what is being practised*

- in the Industries.*
- xii) *They should also have constant interaction with the employer to improve the Quality of Education.*

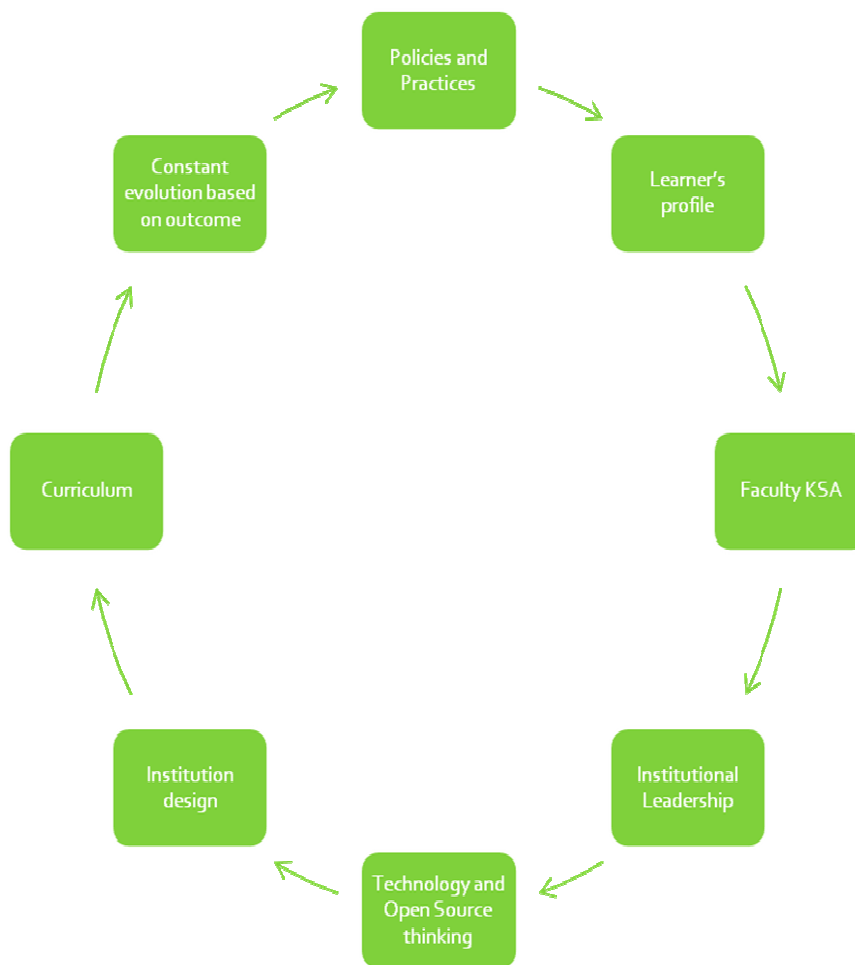
# QUALITY IN HIGHER EDUCATION

▪ **Expected outcomes includes capacity and tasks graduates are expected to perform after graduation**

**A strategic plan to achieve the outcome**

- ...Objective in quantifiable terms
- ...policies
- ...procedures
- ...periodic evaluation to measure outcomes
- ...time frame

**Results of programme assessment of the extent to which they are used to improve the programme must be documented**
